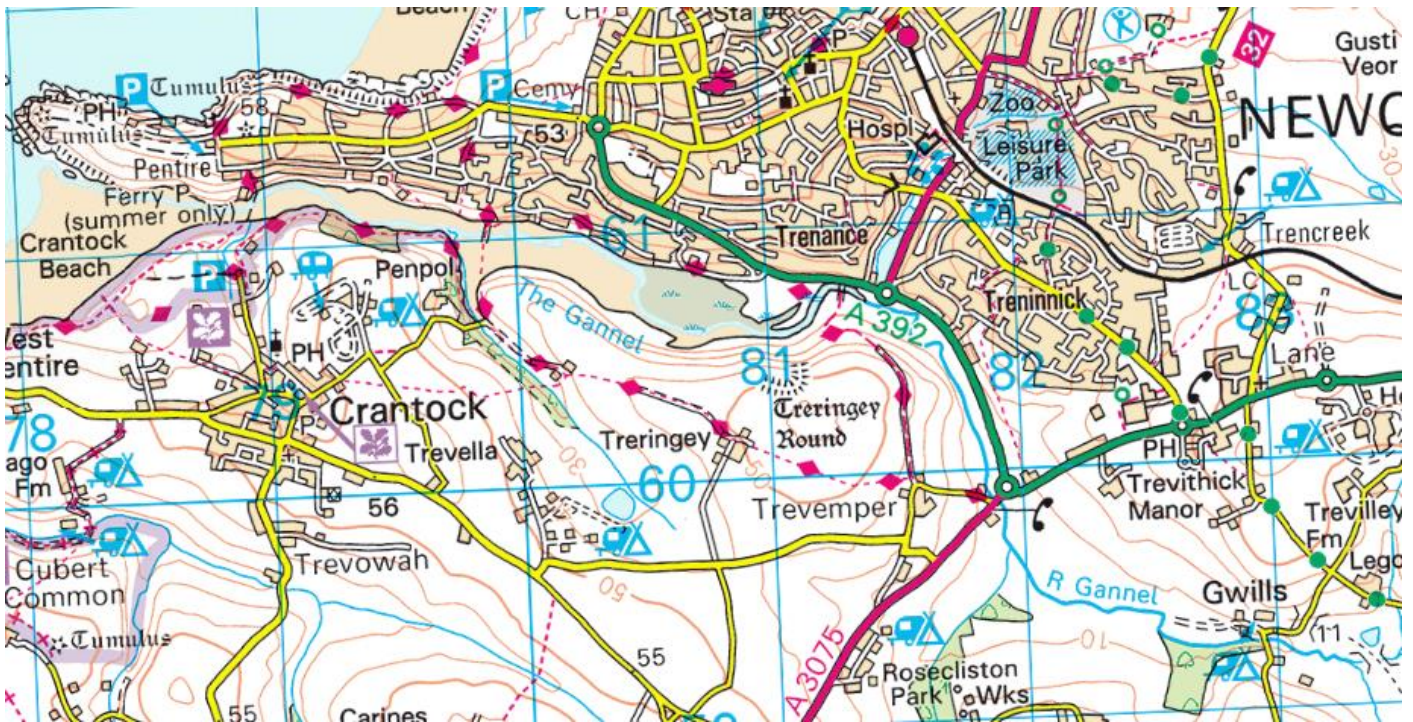

## Geography Resources - Lesson 2

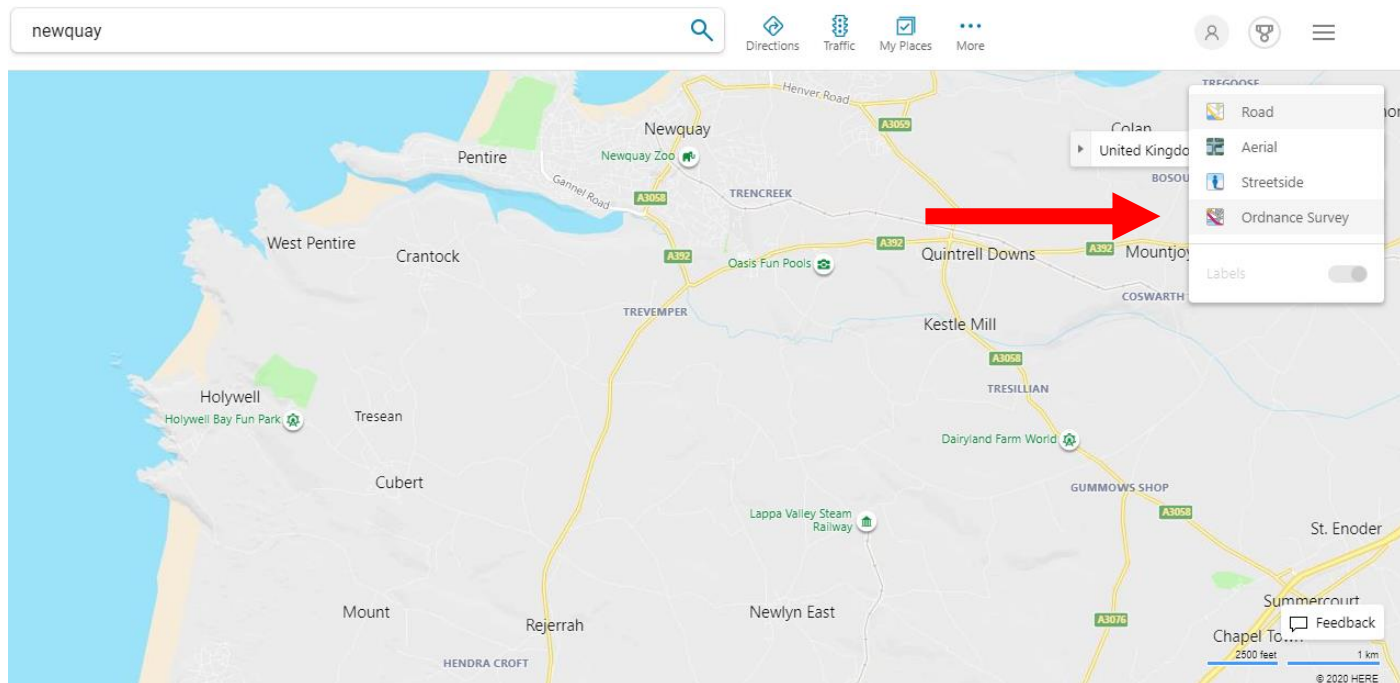
Have a look at this OS map extract and Satellite image of Newquay.

Firstly where is Newquay, you may need to find out. Then annotate or make a list of the different features you can see. Think about both human and physical features of the area. (See example on website)



Using Bing Maps or if you have your own OS map at home use that! Have a look at what rivers you can find. Then search them on [GEOGRAPH](#) to see what they look. If you don't have access to a computer an OS map extract is at the end to use.

If you are using Bing Maps here is how to change it to OS maps

You will notice on both the online OS map and paper OS map there are numbers. These numbers help form something called a grid reference.

Click on the ROCKET on [MAPZONE](#) and see how grid references work. There are 4 and 6 figure grid references. Have a go at finding the grid reference for different features on your maps. You could turn this into a game with family. Record your answers.



Remember to use the LOOK model. Bottom left corner for grid reference numbers.

If you are finding grid references tricky (IT IS HARD!) then just explore the OS Maps, what can you find in the area? Or continue to look at the [MAPZONE](#) website.
