

Curriculum Overview Year 3

Spring (2) 2021 – Roaming Romans

This term we will be learning about the impact of the Roman invasion on life in Britain through our topic of the Roaming Romans!! Having returned to school we will be looking at our learning values and being resilient.

English-

This term we will be using the book "I was there...Boudica's Army" as a class text. We will also be looking at normal things in different ways when writing our Magic Box poems. We will be using inference and use of language through 'Let's Think' sessions. Our writing focus using our new, 'mystery' text will be making our style of writing suit the purpose and continuing to vary and improve our sentences.

PSHE-

This half term we will be studying the unit: 'Focus on Feelings'. This looks at how we recognise feelings in ourselves and others and how our actions have an effect on others.



Maths

This half term our Rock Star Times Tables focus will be consolidating the 4x table and then making links to the 8x table.

We will be looking at money as a topic; converting between pence and pounds.

Ongoing work will be to review our 4 calculations work to consolidate our learning from last term

Next, we aim to move on to our main topic of Fractions which will continue into the Summer Term.

Knowledge & Understanding

Science- Our topic is plants and we will be looking at the parts of a flowering plant and their functions and also taking part in the GYOP (Grow Your Own Potatoes) project.

We will also review the learning from Spring 1 on Animals including Humans.
