

## Writing Week 7 - Lesson 1

Fronted Adverbials: when, where and how.

### Fronted Adverbials

A fronted adverbial describes **how**, **when** or **where** something occurs and goes at the **FRONT** of the sentence. It must always be followed by a comma.

Build detailed sentences - example:

**Crowds Of people had gathered to watch the ticket holders go in.**

1.) Add fronted adverbial:

In front of the gates to Mr Wonka's factory. **crowds of people had gathered to watch the ticket holders go in.**

2.) Add adjectives to make an expanded noun phrase:

In front of the gates to Mr Wonka's factory. bustling, roaring **crowds of people had gathered to watch the ticket holders go in.**

Activity: Build up these sentences from chapters 13 and 14 of Charlie and the Chocolate Factory by adding fronted adverbials and adjectives. Remember to include a variety of how, when and where. You can use the example and work bank to help you.

- 1.) **Stood five children with the grown ups who had come with them.**
- 2.) **Charlie Bucket could hear the shouts of people in the crowd.**
- 3.) **The gates of the factory began to swing open.**
- 4.) **He turned right off the main corridor into a passage.**

Write your sentences in your exercise book or on the writing frame on the next page if you are finding it too tricky.

Once you have finished, remember to re-read and edit your sentences.

- 1.) Can you add some adverbs to your sentences?
- 2.) Create your own "build up" sentences! Remember beautiful, joined handwriting.
